09:30-10:15	Introduction by Ed Serotta, Fabian Rühle (Centropa): “Teaching 20 th Century European Jewish History and the Holocaust Across Borders: The Importance of Oral History and Digital Story Telling in modern Holocaust Education.” Participants then briefly introduce themselves
10:15-11:00	Nina Molho introduces the Centropa film about her family. Screening of the film (20min), followed by discussion on 20 th Century Jewish life in Greece with Nina Molho and Ed Serotta
